## **INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE**

## <u>SS1.4L-H – Stainless Steel Security Safe</u>

When any person is responsible for the management and / or disposal of contaminated waste, it is recommended they comply with Occupational Health & Safety Guidelines for the safe handling of Sharps. Suggested OH & S Procedures are attached to these Instructions.

Your SS1.4L-H Security Safe is supplied with an IDC 1.4 litre Sharps Container (code RE1.4LS) <u>already installed</u> in the Safe. Contaminated waste (needles / syringes) are safely disposed of by depositing directly into the circular chute at the top of the Security Safe.

## FITTING A SHARPS CONTAINER INTO THE STEEL SAFE:

- Safe opens with key provided. Front & Side Panels of the Steel Safe hinge to open.
- Place the Sharps Container inside the Stainless Steel Safe with the Final Closure (white cap) positioned at the inside back wall of the Security Safe. The bio-hazard label on the sharps container faces forward.

Installing the Sharps Container in this way makes sure that the Container is positioned in the Steel Safe <u>directly under</u> the deposit chute, after the Steel Safe is locked & ready for use.

## If the Sharps Container is installed correctly, needles / syringes will deposit successfully into the Sharps Container each time. ##

• The Stainless Steel Safe is now ready to use and must be locked. Hinge the front & side panels back to the closed position & lock the Safe.

## WHEN THE SHARPS CONTAINER IS FULL:

- Unlock the Stainless Steel Safe and hinge open the front / side panels.
- Make sure the Sharps Container is safe to remove.
- <u>Permanently seal</u> the Sharps Container by FIRMLY pressing the Final Closure (white) into the Lid aperture (in the top of the Sharps container).
- The Sharps Container is now LOCKED and ready for safe transport to the place of final disposal.
- An empty replacement Sharps Container can now be installed in the Stainless Steel Security Safe.

For your personal protection, and the safety of others;

**Please remember that:** <u>Polymer products, although puncture resistant, are</u> <u>not entirely puncture proof.</u> <u>Always</u> follow the guidelines set down by the Infection Control Association (or equivalent). A sharps collector should never be filled above the indicator fill line. An article must <u>Never</u> be forced into a Sharps collector. Syringes must <u>Never, Ever</u>, be deposited into a Sharps collector with the needle pointing upwards.

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
